Greetings and Welcome to an exciting and fun filled year at The Little Peoples Workplace!

Our developmentally appropriate educational program is designed to develop the "whole child". Activities and learning experiences are planned to stimulate and encourage intellectual, emotional, physical, and social growth.

We are excited to launch our new curriculum "Frog Street Pre K". As we kick off the new school year, the children will be introduced to themes that will incorporate daily activities that will support the framework for Maryland Model for School Readiness. Our theme for the month of September will be "My School and Me". Our theme topics are; This Way to Pre K, Physical Me, and My Senses. In this theme, the children will explore and discover through math games, cutting activities, creative arts, music and movement, expressing their feelings and literacy filled fun. The children will also learn a calming strategy called S.T.A.R. (Smile, take a deep breath, and relax). This will support the development of building emotional skills. Building friendships has us excited about starting off our new school year!

The Learning activities will include:

• listening to and connecting to stories about school, feelings, friends, all about me and the 5 senses;



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- naming, describing, comparing shapes;
- recognizing positional concepts
- introducing themselves to others;
- beginning to observe their environment.

The instructional plan for "My School and Me" will focus on the following key areas:

- Phonological Awareness: Rhymes, rhyming songs and poems
- Letter knowledge: Alphabet sequence, recognizing letters in his or her name
- Oral Language: Describing, identifying objects; expressing routines
- Comprehension: Noting details; making predictions
- Math: Counting; recognizing shapes and positional concepts
- Social/Emotional Development: Feelings; making friends; class rules; supporting the calming strategy S.T.A.R.
- Science: Observing movement, my senses, environmental changes
- Social Studies: Social skills; roles in school; recognizing rules
